Community Grant Recipients for 2010-2011

Each year, the Junior League of St. Louis (JLSL) provides community grants to St. Louis-based not for profit organizations that provide service within our area of focus: Strengthening our families, with particular emphasis on protecting and empowering our children and women's health and well being.

This year's recipients received their awards at the June 15, 2011 JLSL Annual Membership meeting. Each organization is listed below with the amounts granted. During 2010-2011, the Program Research, Development & Evaluation Committee granted a total of \$5,285 to five organizations.

Safe Connections received a grant in the amount of \$1,125

The mission of Safe Connections is to reduce the impact and incidence of relationship violence and sexual assault through education, crisis intervention, counseling and support services. The funds will be used in three major ways: personal journals for up to 40 clients to complete writing exercises in conjunction with therapy; current published materials for the counseling library; and tools and supplies for support programs.



International Institute received a grant in the amount of \$960



The Women's Entrepreneurial and Textile program trains women in the use of industrial and personal sewing machines for sewing and alterations. This program prepares women for a variety of potential jobs from full time factory sewing work to independent tailoring. The funds will be used to provide "work baskets" for 24 graduates of the program. Each basket will contain a pair of fabric scissors, a pin cushion, a tape measure, pins, marking pencils, and hand needles.

Edgewood Children's Society received a grant in the amount of \$1,800

Edgewood has a residential treatment program for children with severe emotional disorders. They have approximately 50 children in their residential unit. The children have few possessions and no guidance other than the Edgewood child care workers and their therapists. The funds will be used to provide a day of breast care awareness for the girls living on campus and to allow them to purchase properly fitting bras.



Crisis Food Center received a grant in the amount of \$1,000



The Crisis Food Center provides a five day, nutritionally-balanced supply of food to individuals and families who are in need. The organization also operates a gently used clothing distribution area called the Nearly New Shop, which receives numerous requests for back to school clothing. The funds will be used to stock the shop with new underwear, socks and simple hygiene products such as toothbrushes, combs, washcloths, soap and toothpaste.

National Council on Alcoholism & Drug Abuse received a grant in the amount of \$971.67

The funds will be used to purchase DVDs to update their film library. These films target women and children, teaching information and skills needed to make healthy personal decisions. These films include several that, historically, are in high demand on topics such as marijuana, teen alcohol and drug abuse and how alcohol impacts young women.



Done-in-a-Day/Mini-Projects

Lift for Life Gym

Lift for Life Gym offers St. Louis city children a safe, enriching environment in which to strengthen their bodies, enrich their minds, develop healthy social relationships, and learn to make positive life choices.

The JLSL assisted Lift for Life Gym in improving this "fun and healthy haven" for inner city kids.

JLSL members helped organize equipment, paint, decorate and clean.

St. Louis Arc Family Center

The St. Louis Arc hosted a formal dance, the Diamond Ball, for the people supported by the organization. JLSL volunteers assisted with greeting, serving appetizers and with event clean up. The St. Louis Arc is a non-profit agency that provides support and services to adults and children with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families.

Foster and Adoptive Care Coalition

The Foster and Adoptive Care Coalition is a non-profit agency that strives to create permanency in foster children's lives by recruiting and retaining foster/adoptive families. JLSL members assisted with the opening of reFresh, their clothing resale shop targeted for teens and twenties.

Volunteers painted the storage room on the lower level. JLSL volunteers also assisted with an Easter Egg Hunt.

Kingdom House

Kingdom House provides excellent spiritual-based social services to meet community needs. JLSL volunteers accompanied the clients around the shop making sure they received the items they needed.

Mary Ryder Home

Mary Ryder Home is a non-profit residential care facility that touches the lives of hundreds of St. Louis community seniors, struggling in poverty, who can no longer live independently.

JLSL members played games with the senior women residents of the Mary Ryder Home.

St. Patrick Center

St. Patrick Center is the largest provider of homeless services in Missouri and helps individuals and families move from homelessness to independence in a measurable, cost effective manner.

JLSL members helped St. Patrick Center facilitate their public clothing giveaway.

Haven House

Haven House is dedicated to providing the comforts of home and support to families traveling to St. Louis for medical care. JLSL members assisted with grounds cleanup for spring.

Ronald McDonald House

Ronald McDonald House provides housing for families who have seriously ill children being treated at area hospitals.

JLSL members prepared dinner for the families staying at the Ronald McDonald House.

Glass Slipper

Junior League members provided prom clothes and accessories as well as assisting students from Nottingham Community Access & Job Training (CAJT) High School for their prom on May 6th. The mission of CAJT is to ensure that students with developmental disabilities, serious physical impairments, and other health problems are prepared for the world of work and adulthood.

Food Outreach

Food Outreach provides nutritional support and enhances the quality of life of men, women and children living with HIV/AIDS or cancer in the St. Louis Metro area. JLSL volunteers helped cook and pack food.



On April 2, 2011, the St. Louis Crisis Nursery honored the Junior League of St. Louis at their Razzle Dazzle Ball. President, Sue Felling accepted the award on the behalf of the JLSL.

St. Louis Family Theatre Series

Celebrating its 24th year in the community, this program introduces over 30,000 St. Louis area school children and their families to live theatre annually. Over the years, the St. Louis Family Theatre Series' (SLFTS) performances have entertained almost a half million young people. The SLFTS began in 1986 as a Junior League of St. Louis (JLSL) priority group, then called Audience of the Arts. Because it had made such a significant contribution to the community by touching the lives of so many children, it was made a JLSL perpetual project in 1989, on JLSL's 75th anniversary.





JLSL volunteers working with SLFTS have several unique training opportunities which include serving as a docent in the classroom or as an usher at the theatre. Many local schools plan field trips to see performances each year. In preparation for the "theatre experience", a docent will visit each classroom and talk about what to expect at the theatre and during the performance. The children can ask questions, since for many of them this is the first time they will experience "live theatre".

As an usher, volunteers assist the young theatre-goers from the minute they walk in the door, ensuring that their theatrical experience is enjoyable and memorable.


The JLSL looks forward to our continued involvement with The St. Louis Family Theatre Series and invites you to join us for this amazing theatrical experience.


