Done-in-a-Day/Mini-Projects

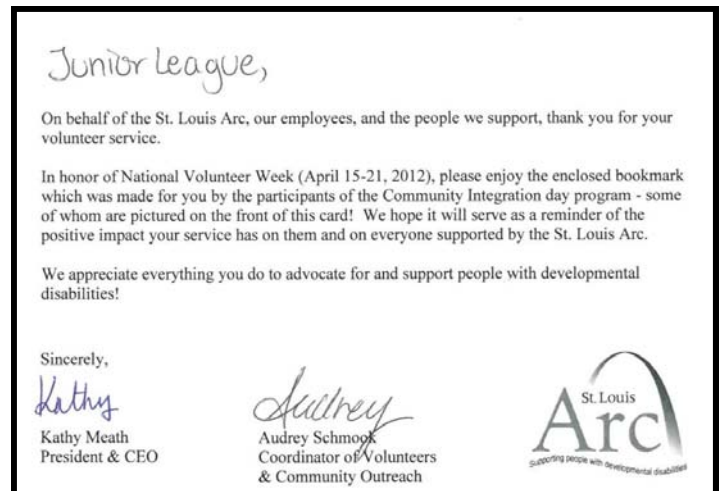
Food Outreach

Food Outreach provides nutritional support and enhances the quality of life for men, women and children living with HIV/AIDS or cancer in the St. Louis area. Twice JLSL Members helped package and store homemade meals, helping feed over a thousand individuals who are living each day with either HIV/AIDS or cancer.



St. Louis ARC

St Louis ARC provides support and services to children and adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities. DIAD Volunteers helped with activities such as face painting, crafts, and clean-up at St Louis ARC's annual picnic. On another date, JLSL Volunteers served as chaperones at the Valentine's Day dance for St. Louis ARC clients.



Lemay Child and Family Center

Lemay Child and Family Center provides the highest quality childcare to families in need. They also offer parent education, provide access to social work services, and help to connect families with services for their children. JLSL Volunteers at this DIAD helped weed and prepare the vegetable garden for students to plant seeds.

Done-in-a-Day/Mini-Projects Continued

Ronald McDonald House

Ronald McDonald House provides a comfortable place to stay for families with seriously ill children who are receiving treatment at St. Louis area hospitals. As Dinner Program participants, Junior League Members helped reduce some of the incredible stress experienced by the families by preparing and serving a home cooked meal.

Edgewood Children's Center

JLSL Members helped the girls at the Edgewood Children's Center learn about nutrition, confidence and living a healthy life style.



Nurses for Newborns

JLSL Members assisted with sorting baby clothing and making cute baby outfits, organizing donations, checking expiration dates, cleaning toys and making care packages.



Foster and Adoptive Care Coalition

The Foster and Adoptive Coalition [RE]FRESH shop is a resale shop which focuses on trendy clothing appropriate for teens. Youth in foster care get 90% off the already low resale prices, and other kids living with foster/adoptive families get 30% off. In addition, youth in foster care can intern at [RE]FRESH, and they're matched with a community mentor to help them find a job once their internship is completed. JLSL Volunteers helped tag [RE]FRESH clothing donations.

The Foster and Adoptive Care Coalition receives hundreds of thank-you notes from foster kids who received holiday gifts through the Little Wishes program. JLSL Volunteers at this DIAD helped match thank you notes to donors and label and stuff envelopes with thank you notes.

St. Louis Children's Hospital

JLSL Members helped pediatric patients at St. Louis Children's Hospital by preparing materials used to make comfort pillows! Comfort pillows are given to patients in order to help alleviate their stress levels while they are visiting the doctor.

Lift for Life Gym

JLSL Volunteers painted a room.

Nottingham Community Access and Job Training High School

Nottingham CAJT is a high school for students with moderate to severe developmental disabilities. DIAD Volunteers helped the students prepare for their prom by assembling goody bags (school supplies & personal hygiene products donated by Chris Lineback) and making corsages for the prom.

Grace Hill

The mission of Grace Hill is to provide opportunities for individuals, families and communities in St. Louis to be stronger, healthier and more self-reliant. During this event, JLSL Members helped 10 Grace Hill clients who had been out of the work force and/or never interviewed for a job prepare for the interview process.

St. Patrick Center

JLSL Members helped facilitate clothing giveaways to St. Patrick Center clients who are homeless or at risk of being homeless. Activities included helping clients find donations, organizing and folding the clothing items and tracking the number of patrons who came to the center that day.

Haven House

Haven House provides food, lodging, the comforts of home, and a community of support for families traveling to St. Louis for medical needs. JLSL Volunteers assisted Haven House with cleaning and decorating the private rooms and common areas.

Mary Ryder Home



Twice JLSL Volunteers played games and visited with residents from the Mary Ryder Home. Mary Ryder Home provides a safe home, compassionate care and enriched life to senior women in need.

The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society

The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Hunt for a Cure is a spring egg hunt and informational event to raise awareness about their mission to find a cure for blood cancers and improve the quality of life for patients and their families. It is also an opportunity for LLS to thank their volunteers and the greater St. Louis community for their support throughout the year.

It is the largest free family egg hunt in St. Louis. JLSL Volunteers set up egg trails for different age groups, greeted families and guided them to the trails, passed out give-away items and donated refreshments and cleaned up at the end of the event.

St. Louis Family Theatre Series

Celebrating its 24th year in the community, this program introduces over 20,000 St. Louis area school children and their families to live theatre annually. Over the years, the St. Louis Family Theatre Series' (SLFTS) performances have entertained almost a half million young people. The SLFTS began in 1986 as a Junior League of St. Louis (JLSL) priority group, then called Audience of the Arts. Because it had made such a significant contribution to the community by touching the lives of so many children, it was made a JLSL perpetual project in 1989, on JLSL's 75th anniversary.

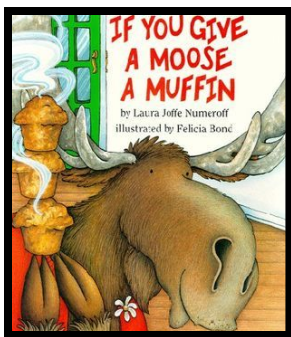


JLSL Volunteers working with SLFTS have several unique training opportunities which include serving as a docent in the classroom or as an usher at the theatre. Many local schools plan field trips to see performances each year. In preparation for the "theatre experience", a docent will visit each classroom and talk about what to expect at the theatre and during the performance. The children can ask questions, since for many of them this is the first time they will experience "live theatre".

As an usher, volunteers assist the young theatre-goers from the minute they walk in the door, ensuring that their theatrical experience is enjoyable and memorable.

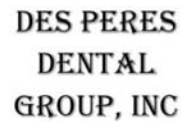

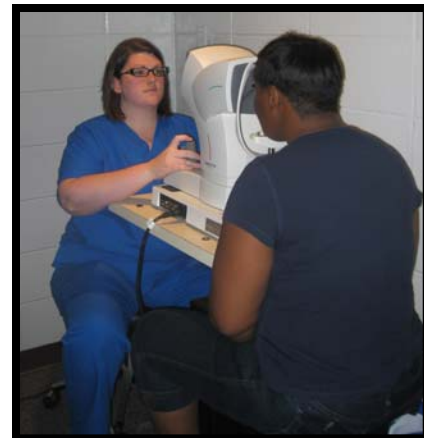

A Day at the Capitol—Promoting the Cyberbullying Bill

The JLSL State Legislative Issues Committee (SLIC) has received National attention regarding work to make positive changes on current Cyberbullying laws. On February 8th, Junior League Members boarded a motor coach to Jefferson City for the annual A Day at the Capitol. JLSL Members, along with Junior Leagues from St. Joseph, Kansas City, and Springfield were introduced on both the House and Senate floors. JLSL Member and former Missouri Senator, Betty Sims, spoke about *Women in Politics* during lunch at the Governor’s Mansion. After lunch and a tour, Members went on legislator visits asking for support of Housebill 1049, which seeks to create a standardized way of handling incidents of cyberbullying in schools.
