As we close out 2012-2013, we prepare for another significant anniversary – the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Junior League of St. Louis! In 1914, Margaret McKittrick and Ann Drew were worried about the clock ticking on the women's suffrage movement. Women were not allowed to vote, and they thought it was about time that changed. As leaders in the local St. Louis suffrage movement, they reached out to a number of women and encouraged them to become active in their community. This led to way to the formation of the Junior League of St. Louis, officially begun in November 1914 in Margaret McKittrick's home.

What has occurred in the passing of those 100 years is amazing! We will be taking time throughout 2014 to reflect and celebrate our accomplishments while at the same time, building the capacity of our organization for the next 100 years.

I look forward to next year and my sneak peak of the 2013-2014 Annual Report, which will be filled again with examples of the plentiful training and volunteer opportunities offered to our members, but which will also recapture the events surrounding our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. # St. Louis Family Theatre Series—25th Anniversary

Celebrating its 25th year in the community, this program introduces over 20,000 St. Louis area school children and their families to live theatre annually. Over the years, the St. Louis Family Theatre Series' (SLFTS) performances have entertained almost a half million young people. The SLFTS began in 1986 as a Junior League of St. Louis (JLSL) priority group, then called Audience of the Arts. Because it made such a significant contribution to the community by touching the lives of so many children, it was made a JLSL perpetual project in 1989, on JLSL's 75th anniversary.





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JLSL Members working with SLFTS have several unique training

opportunities which include serving as a docent in the classroom or as an usher at the theatre. Many local schools plan field trips to see performances each year. In preparation for the "theatre experience", a docent will visit each classroom and talk about what to expect at the theatre and during the performance. The children can ask questions, since for many of them this is the first time they will experience "live theatre". As an usher, JLSL Members assist the young theatre-goers from the minute they walk in the door, ensuring that their theatrical experience is enjoyable and memorable.

# STRONG WOMEN & FAMILIES health & resource fair

The Junior League of St. Louis' partnership with Grace Hill was a huge success for our 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Health and Resource Fair! Over 325 low-income families attended the April 6<sup>th</sup> event and received access to a variety of health and human services to help build a healthy and strong community.

This one-stop fair had approximately 70 community partners providing information, services, and necessary follow up. Many health services such as eye exams, lab work, dental exams and cleanings were offered in Grace Hill's state of the art Health Center. Mercy's mammography van provided free screenings and follow up services to participants. Grace Hill provided Infant CPR classes and First Book - St Louis gave away free children's books.

Our success was largely due to the JLSL and Grace Hill volunteers that canvased the neighborhoods in the weeks leading up to the event because attendance was largely based upon word of mouth. # State Legislative Issues Committee (SLIC)

## Update on House Bill 134

On April 3<sup>rd</sup>, the bill passed in the House of Representatives with 141 to 9 votes in support of the bill. The bill was then referred to the Senate Education Committee under the leadership of David Pearce. On April 24<sup>th</sup> the Education Committee had a hearing on HB134. SLIC representatives, Sue Allen, Sydney and Michelle Wilhelm, as well as other organizations from across the state testified in front of the committee.

On May 8<sup>th</sup>, HB134 was finally voted out of the Senate Education Committee. The committee did update the bill's verbiage without affecting its essence. At the time when the bill was voted out of the committee, there was only one week left in the legislative session. To increase the chances for the bill to pass, HB134 was attached as an amendment to a Senate Bill (SB) 77 and later Senate Bill 256.



JLSL Members Attended A Day at the Capitol in Jefferson City on February 20th

During the week of May 13<sup>th</sup>, it became clear that a couple of Senators were opposed to the bill's verbiage. Senator Jolie Justus from Kansas City expressed opposition to the bill and threatened to filibuster it if it went to the Senate floor. With less than a week left in the session and multiple bills still needing to be passed, the Senate couldn't afford a filibuster. As result, the bill's verbiage was removed from the SB77.

Senator Justus wanted the bill to have a special clause providing protection to the enumerated classes. After discussion between Representative Sue Allen and Senator Justus, the Senator agreed to compromise and pass the bill with the original verbiage, protecting ALL the kids without exception. Unfortunately by then, a couple of conservative Senators retracted their support and wanted to put the clause on the bill that would specifically prohibit a school bullying policy to contain protection for any enumerated classes. The session came to an end and the bill never made it to the Senate floor.

Though the bill didn't pass, it moved in the legislative process further than during any previous year. The process was a good learning opportunity, and it is now clear who the true supporters are, as well as those in opposition. This information will allow JLSL to come up with a stronger plan for next year.
